David recently served as the Director of Analytics for the Troubled Asset Relief Program (TARP) during the Obama Administration with the U.S. Department of the Treasury. He led efforts to develop a strategic identity, improve transparency and accountability for the financial crisis of 2008-2009. Prior to that, he was appointed in the George W. Bush Administration and was one of the youngest members of the Senior Executive Service as the Advisor to the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development as the housing and subprime mortgage crisis unfolded. He also was the Director of Performance for the U.S. Small Business Administration leading coordination of major reforms for the Agency rated the “most improved” among all federal agencies during his tenure.

Prior to his Appointment, David was a Senior Consultant at Booz Allen Hamilton, a top-tier management consulting firm, advising some of the largest corporations and governments around the world.



He has also been active for the Republican National Committee in Washington D.C. and has managed several political campaigns around the country.
