Artist, graphic designer/art director, musician, and color expert Margie Deeb is the first artist/author to publish books on color specifically addressing the challenges presented by working with beads. She is currently living outside of Atlanta, with her musician/programmer husband, Darren, and their dogs.

Her books include the popular [The Beader's Guide to Color](#) and [The Beader's Color Palette](#), which the Library Journal voted the Best Craft How-To book of 2009. Margie discussed her approach to color on a 2008 episode of the PBS TV show "Beads, Baubles and Jewels."

Twice a year she publishes the invaluable [Color Report for Bead & Jewelry Designers](#), in conjunction with Pantone the world's global color authority.

Her passion for color and movement is the driving force in all her creations. In addition to her visual arts in oils, watercolor and charcoal, she is also a musician. She works with all kinds of beading methods, include on- and off-loom weaving and stringing. She is most known for her fantastically colorful loom-woven pieces.

Margie conducts beading and color courses for artists, interior designers, knitters, beadars, and jewelry designers online and throughout the US and Canada. Her art is featured in galleries across the country and in many books, including *One Big Beautiful Bead* by Sarah McConnell, *500 Beaded Objects: New Dimensions in Contemporary Beadwork*, *Findings and Finishings* by Sharon Bateman, and *Beading On A Loom* by Don Pierce, and *Beading Across America: Jewelry Inspiration from Coast to Coast* (Kalmbach Publishing, Spring 2011).

Her free monthly color column, "[Margie's Muse](#)," is available on her website. She produces a free graphically enhanced podcast, "Margie Deeb's Color Celebration," available on iTunes.
